





#### **Our Aims and Activities**

Founded by carers in 1990, our befriending projects improve the quality of life of socially excluded children (aged 6+), young people and adults with learning disabilities, overcoming social barriers and lack of opportunity and giving respite to family carers.

220 members are supported by 200 peer-age volunteers across the Scottish Borders, nurturing friendships, providing opportunities and improving wellbeing, confidence & social skills. Our support is longterm and sustained throughout transitions. It is excellent preparation for employment and independent living and provides regular respite for 250 family carers.

Our service model has developed through co-production with families and members and is unique for its variety and the numbers it supports. It includes 60 traditional 1:1 links and 35 befriending groups in community venues, schools and on Zoom. Group activities are similar to mainstream youth and social groups, including arts & crafts, drama, film, gardening, music, cookery, keep fit, games, outdoor adventures and overnight trips.

Our service is delivered through four local projects (Berwickshire, Central Borders, Roxburgh and Tweeddale) each with its own staff and local committee of stakeholders. They work with schools, Borders College, Social Work and care providers to reach as many people as possible. Volunteers are PVG checked, trained (including adult and child protection) & supported by staff.

#### The need for the service

Our members have a lifelong condition that affects their development and means they need help to understand information, learn skills and live independently. Cerebral Palsy, Downs Syndrome & Autism are often involved, with high accompanying levels of epilepsy & sensory impairment.

They are socially excluded throughout their lives: Most are taught in additional needs units and lack opportunities for friendships and activities that are crucial to wellbeing and achieving their full potential: Only around 1% of people with learning disabilities have a partner in adult life and 4.5% a job (2019 LDSS). They are at risk if they go into the community on their own and there are almost no mainstream community activities they can access.

Family carers have a role which is difficult to sustain, isolating, reduces their opportunities, affects their wellbeing and makes them twice as likely to live in poverty.

The need for community involvement, friendships and activities that are fun and enable personal growth is constantly expressed by the members, families and care professionals we work with and is well-recognised in academic studies & government strategies.

# **Activities 2022-23**

In the 12 months to the end of September 2023 we supported 220 members with learning disabilities. There were 65 1:1 links and 243 member places in 35 befriending groups. 88 members had both a 1:1 link and a group, or were in two groups. 255 family carers enjoyed short break respite and there was a parents craft & chat group in Tweeddale.

#### New groups included:

- An in-school lunchtime group at Burnfoot Primary (a 10%/20% SIMD area in Hawick).
- An adult lunch club in Galashiels (Brunch Bunch), responding to a reduction in statutory day services and the cost-of-living crisis.
- Three intergenerational Zoom groups (baking, home gardening and bingo). These had their origins in the pandemic and are now a regular part of our service.
- Two "Growing Interests" daytime groups in Hawick (Newsroom & Lifeskills) See a breakdown of all our groups.


#### Highlights of the year included:

- Our Friendship Day in October
- Pantomimes in December and January by our <u>Central Borders</u> and <u>Roxburgh</u> branches.
- In February 2023 we won the overall Loving our Volunteers award, recognising outstanding volunteering in the Scottish Borders. Three of our volunteers were also recognised.
- In April 2023 we held the first <u>Charmian Challenge</u> fun run in memory of former director Charmian Ledsham, with 120 members, carers and volunteers taking part.
- In May 2023 we ran our most ambitious overnight trips yet: our first two-night trip on the overnight ferry to Amsterdam (<u>video</u> & <u>photoreport</u>) and our largest trip ever, by 12 members, 8 volunteers and 3 staff to Keilder(<u>video</u> & <u>photoreport</u>). Both were joint trips between two branches, ensuring new friends were made.

A massive vote of thanks goes to <u>our funders over the last year</u>: our work would not be possible without their generous support.

#### Jokokubos (16) and Simonas

Jokokubos (16) and Simonas (13) are brothers from Lithuania

**Simonas** is on the autistic spectrum and has been with Interest Link since March 2022, joining The Duns group first & now he is attending the Kelso Group. English is his second language. He was quiet & shy when he first attended the group, but now he has gained confidence & talks to other group members. He is kind & friendly & has a great sense of humour & gets on well with everybody.

At times he has challenges with making choices & understanding game rules. Winning & losing games can be a big challenge for him but with our empathy & guidance he manages his time in the sessions. He enjoys attending the groups & tries out the arts and crafts cookery and drama projects. He has settled into the group and has become a popular member. He is always friendly to other group members & now initiates conversations.

Simonas has gained confidence since joining the group & has asked to join group WhatsApp he has made friends in the group with people from different schools and different towns. He has also joined the local Borders Youth Theatre as he has a keen interest in drama. Interest Link worked with Simonas & his Mum to ensure that he settled into the BYT drama group.

**Jokokubos** like his brother is on the autistic spectrum and has been with Interest Link since March 2022 joining The Duns group first & now he attends the Kelso Group. The brothers get on well with each other Jokokubos will talk with Simonas he will tell Simonas how to behave

Jokokubos likes to be on the periphery he enjoys walking around, he does not spend much time on the activities but takes part as best as he can. He will sit down for a snack & enjoys the food.

Jokokubos has favourite subjects, it used to be talking about going to the casino, now he likes to talk about cars & gaming. Jokokubus wrote a letter to the coordinator about PlayStations & Xboxes: his Mum said he had never done this before.

Jokokubos said "I enjoy walks to the park, I enjoyed the café. I meet new people. Art and crafts are fun". Simonas said "I meet new friends, We have fun playing games and doing crafts and I can speak out in the group"

The boys parents are thankful for the group that enables the boys to socialise.

Jurgita the boys' Mum told me how much the boys miss the group during the holidays and said "They have met new friends/people and they come home chatting, laughing and smiling. I can go out with friends or I can go shopping and have some me time".

#### Linda

Linda is a 46 year old mother of two (one of whom is also a member of Interest Link Borders). She has moderate learning disabilities and lives relatively independently with the support of social work and her elderly mother who lives 10 miles away. She has been an active member of ILB since 2018. Linda wears hearing aids, has asthma and suffered severe trauma in her earlier years. Despite these barriers she is

resilient and a good mother to her children. In the year and a half since I joined the Interest Link staff I have watched her blossom from a quiet woman who wouldn't make eye contact to someone who has a new-found confidence and meaning in her life.

Linda enjoys going to our allotment every week and is part of a tight-knit group of friends there. She is a supportive friend to another of our members who suffers from depression at times, encouraging him to come along when he is feeling low. Recently we had a lot of work done upgrading the allotment and she helped plan the improvements. She has grown in confidence enormously and has really found her voice through the allotment, not to mention that her horticultural skills have come on in leaps and bounds! She has passed these on to her daughter and now grows a wide range of veg and flowers in her own garden. She enjoys a lovely bond with our main volunteer and they share a great respect for one another. A new volunteer who started recently owes a lot to Linda for helping him to find his feet as a newbie to gardening.

Linda also joined a newly formed Interest Link Health and Wellbeing group in January along with eight other members who meet monthly to enjoy artistic activities. She has formed close friendships with a couple of the other women who attend and they now meet socially out-with this group which is super to see. This is a group where people can relax, be mindful and talk about any issues they have in their lives as well as have the pleasure of enjoying being creative together.

Linda has recently been supported along with some other members to start a New Age Kurling group. She also volunteers for the ILB youth group her daughter used to attend, and is a great asset to the group.

#### **Faye**

Faye is 22 and lives locally with her mum and dad in a small town—she is a very popular and much loved member of our crew! She has a loving and warm family. Faye has the best sense of humour and is great fun. She has been with us since she was 11 years old and has been in our children's and youth groups. She is also now in the adult service where she does either crafts or baking. She has been with us to Belfast, Manchester and Dundee on our residential trips too.

Faye has Down's Syndrome, is non-verbal and has coeliac disease. Faye requires 24 hour support and supervision, so when she is at the group her dad says that they can have time together as a couple in the knowledge that Faye is not only safe but also having fun with an established group of her friends. They have recently become grandparents so for Auntie Faye to have time away also affords the family extra baby times! When Faye is away for the weekends with us, mum and dad are able to attend rugby games or just relax together with regular pics on WhatsApp from us of what Faye is up to, whether it's The Titanic Exhibition, indoor skydiving or (gluten free) afternoon tea! The family say they love knowing that Faye is having different experiences with her peers and always fully support all our project plans and ideas.

The group also allows Faye to maintain independent social connections with other members Faye has known since her school days. Mum says that this consistency has made the transition to adult services a little easier as there was no break or change in her access to Interest Link at a time when everything else changed – even during lockdown, Faye accessed our Zoom sessions so that the connections were maintained.

Faye travels in one of our group taxis and this not only boosts her independence, but means that no one needs to be out and about driving Faye to the group to then to have to come back later on – this increases the respite time for the family as their evening is not fractured.

#### 0

O is 9 years old and lives with her parents and sister in Galashiels. She was referred to us during lockdown and then we met her at our lunchtime school sessions before she then joined the children's group - O was shy when she first attended but always has a big smile. She has settled in very well and has formed a particular bond with a volunteer, Martyna. They do the activities together within the group and so far, O has been involved with our calendar project and has also decorated a Christmas cake with handmade fondant snowmen.

O comes happily into all the sessions and is so excited when she sees her new friends – she is a lovely girl and we are so pleased to have her with us. O has learning disabilities as well as communication and physical health issues so she requires a high level of care, and has previously tried to attend mainstream social/activity groups but these have not worked out for her. Mum heard about Interest Link and sent us a message – our first meeting was a Zoom hello so we could tell mum more about what we do and answer her questions.

Her mum sent me this message "O has very much enjoyed coming to the group from the start. She doesn't tend to like doing things. Once she's in the house that's normally it but since starting this group O really likes going out. Her confidence has grown a lot. I'm so glad she enjoys going because it gives her time to socialise out with school hours but it also allows myself to have a bit of breathing space knowing that she is in a safe place and is happy to be there. This makes family life as a whole much easier and I am less stressed. The opportunities of the different activities that she does is great. I am thoroughly happy that I was able to find this group and allow O to expand her skills."

#### Aileen Marie

Aileen Marie is 26 and lives with her mum, dad and brother in a small town in the Borders. They are a close knit family and Aileen Marie is also a devoted Auntie.

Aileen Marie has been with Interest Link for 12 years and has a learning disability. She was previously in our children and youth groups and went on our most recent residential trip to iFly in Manchester before she transferred over to the adult service where she attends our fortnightly crafting group. Aileen Marie has already developed strong bonds with the crafting crew: There is a range of different ages and characters within the group and this means there is never a shortage of chatter and laughter or reassurance when required too.

She currently has an employment placement at a local catering and gardening project run by a support agency.

The respite element of the groups and events such as our Friendship Day are a two way street for Aileen Marie and her mum. Her mum has recently suffered from ill health and Aileen Marie has subsequently become one of her mum's carers helping with practical daily elements as well as emotional support. The times with us at Interest Link mean a lot to the family as mum knows that Aileen Marie is having fun and

also having a break - mum finds it very reassuring to know that Aileen Marie is maintaining her social connections. She feels that she can relax knowing Aileen Marie is safe and enjoying herself with us – the taxi to and from the group means her mum doesn't have to worry about travelling either.

Aileen Marie's mum says "without you Aileen Marie would not have the confidence to do the things she does in the group, I know she is safe and happy. She has made a solid bunch of friends and it gets her out and about – she gets so much from her time with the groups".

#### Jack at Brunch Bunch

The Brunch Bunch runs fortnightly in a local food surplus café called Café Recharge in Galashiels. Sessions are 2 hours long and consist of crafting or an activity and then our brunch/lunch. So far, our activities have included mug painting. Easter cards and jewellery making.

Jack has previously been a member of our evening baking sessions but a change in his health meant that these were no longer suitable for him. We were very sad to hear this as Jack was frequently our star baker – he has a great eye for detail.

Jack's family were one of the reasons we started to realise that a daytime session was needed after his mum called after lockdown to say that his day service was being shut and there was a huge gap in activities for her son. As Jack was already with us, we knew that the model could work in a daytime setting so we are delighted that Jack attends The Brunch Bunch!

Jack has autism and is mostly non verbal so his mum has shared this with us –

"Thanks to the Brunch Bunch, Jack is able to still maintain his connections with his friends at Interest Link and he gets the chance to be with other people as well as learn more about the etiquette of eating out. I know that Jack enjoys choosing his own choice of meal from the menu and enjoys attending with his support staff – this is a valuable chance for Jack to just relax and enjoy a shared experience"

Jack's mum also told us that "Although Jack is predominantly non-verbal, he is able to tell me who he has seen at the Brunch Bunch as they are people he has met before and I can see that he is enjoying the sessions, I can see that he is happy to attend. It's an extra opportunity for him to mix with friends outwith the family too.

#### Harry

Harry has a learning disability and is 14 years old and lives with his grannie and single mum Sally. Harry attended our Wilton School Group for many years before he moved to Hawick High School. Harry was supported by staff in the Additional Needs Unit at Wilton where Interest Link ran an online and face to face group session with 4 members and 4 young peer mentors. Harry enjoyed many happy years engaging with Becca from Interest Link with a variety of group activities with his friends.

Harry moved to Hawick High School when he turned 12, where he continued to access our senior school service with an older group of members who are supported in the Hawick High School Unit for Additional Needs children.

Harry is now in our evening Children's group. He settled in well although he was anxious at first and needed mum to stay for the first few sessions. He especially enjoys board games and loves to interact with staff and members of the group. His laugh is infectious and is always commented on.

Sarah our sessional worker also works in the Additional Needs Unit at Hawick High School, so is another familiar face for him and makes him feel less anxious about being away from mum.

Sally really depends on our service and feels happy and confident that Harry is with people he knows and now feels safe. Sally is able to have a little bit of time to herself to catch up with what she chooses to do. Sally also enjoys looking at our Facebook Page. She is delighted that Harry enjoys our activities especially Drama. Harry is always eager to come to his group and sad when the session finishes. The taxi ride is very important to both Sally and Harry. It gives Sally extra time to herself and Harry thoroughly enjoys the taxi ride with Sarah as escort and his friends. It is fun to have a spin around Hawick as the taxi driver drops off members.

Sally is grateful for everything we do and the transport that we offer helps alleviate any extra stress. "Harry loves the group and has so much fun. Without these little groups our kids wouldn't have the chance to meet and make friends in similar situation and experience these activities thank you to all of you for making this happen".

#### **Lawrence and David**

Lawrence and David are twins, they are 9 years old and live with their parents and younger sister Daisy. Lawrence has ADHD and a learning disability. David has a learning disability and is autistic. David has more difficulty understanding and navigating the world around him.

Lawrence attends our evening Children's group while David attends a school lunch group. David enjoys one to one time with other school children and young peer mentors from mainstream school classes.

Lawrence is very happy in the evening group and it offers him an opportunity to meet other children from different schools. He especially likes working with Leanne our Baking Tutor, learning to prepare food from different countries around the world. He also enjoys Drama sessions, where he is learning to express himself and think creatively. These sessions offer a great opportunity for him to problem solve and work in a team with other children and peer mentors, supporting him to feel more confident.

Mum Kendra is very happy that both boys are having an opportunity where they spend quality time meeting other children as they have very limited opportunities to socialize. These opportunities also give mum and dad time to spend with other siblings.

Interest Link have regular open parents' evenings where the boys parents are invited along to see what Lawrence has been up to. Kendra also enjoys interacting with our Facebook Page looking at photos and videos from David's group. The boys like it that they have their own special Interest Link groups and enjoy sharing stories with each other when at home.

#### Chris

Chris is 33, has a learning disability and suffers from epilepsy. Following an accident two years ago he needs support in walking. He lives with his mother Agnes, is isolated from friends and has very little access to any social life in the evenings and at weekends.

Agnes is anxious about Chris but very happy with a new fortnightly group of ours, Best Friends Forever, as Chris has settled into the group perfectly. The group was created for members over the age of 26 and meets 1pm-4pm in local cafes, where they can be socially active and feel safe. Members are encouraged to be as independent as possible, traveling to venues, ordering and paying for their own lunch and drinks. The group share their news and talk about things that are important to them.

During the pandemic Interest Link found different ways to connect Chris with friends through Zoom. Chris's mum Agnes is a sole carer and was very grateful for the support that the organization gave her and Chris during this very difficult and challenging time. Chris was very excited about getting back to normal and meeting up with his friends face to face, but continues his interaction through our WhatsApp groups and posts his many drawings on Facebook. Agnes says "connecting with other members is a great idea. I know how much it has been a benefit to Christopher, thank you Val and Becca".

Chris says "I feel I am really good at saying things online now and it's great to see my pictures on Facebook. We have great banter at the café group and I am very excited when it is the next meeting and I can see my friends".

Agnes always reiterates how grateful she is for the support that they both receive.

#### **James**

James lives with his parents on an isolated farm. James is in his 50's and has Downs' Syndrome. He has been a member of Interest Link Roxburgh for many years and attends the Caledonian Group.

The group is the only opportunity that offers a social outlet for him and a chance to meet up with his friends in the evening now he does not have a day centre place. During the pandemic Interest bought an iPad for James so he could pop into a scheduled weekly "Banter Group", Bingo and Karaoke sessions. This undoubtedly enhanced his mental health and well- being. James facial expressions sum up how happy it makes him feel to be reunited with his friends face to face and he loves Drama and Music. "I like to speak to people and tell them about me and where I go this makes me happy. I enjoy the Banter Group and meeting new friends from everywhere. I like singing with the group on Music Group. I like drama and shows."

James's parents have felt isolated as they get older, and the respite time is vital as it enables them to have a break in the knowledge that he is in safe hands.
